SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

To have your child baptized, you must be a registered parishioner in good standing for at least 3 months and schedule at least one month prior to the desired date. A baptismal class is required for first time parents. Please call the office to schedule.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

To be married at the parish, you or your intended spouse or your parents must be a registered parishioner in good standing for at least six months. The couple will need to talk with a priest or deacon six months before the anticipated wedding date. Marriage preparation classes are required. If a prior marriage is involved, one year notice may be necessary.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK (ANOINTING)

Anointing is available upon request for serious illness, before surgery and in an emergency any time. Also offered after all Masses the first weekend of the month.

PASTORAL VISITATIONS

Please call the parish office when a parishioner is admitted to any of the area hospitals/care centers - even temporarily or is homebound and desires Holy Communion or a pastoral visit.

In the Gospel today, we are introduced to Martha and Mary in Luke's Gospel. It is a familiar story seemingly about hospitality, but of course there is always more to a parable than meets the eye. Martha is "burdened with much serving" while Mary sits at Jesus' feet and listens to him. The original Greek says "listens to his word (Logos)." Sitting at the feet and listening is acknowledging authority.

Martha, Luke tells us, is overwhelmed by the fact that there are many things to do. It is a sense of a distraction rather than any sort of mental condition or obsessive compulsiveness.

Martha asks, "Lord, does it not concern you..." It is the same sort of question that the disciples ask Jesus when he is asleep in the boat during the storm. But really, it is more of an accusation than a question, "Mary has abandoned me to do all the work."

Jesus points out that Martha is caught up in the entanglements of the world, which are many. She is missing out on what the priority is. While hosting takes time and energy, the real point of hosting is the welcoming and the listening to the guest.

We may find ourselves burdened with many details in our relationship with Jesus. We need to be reminded that like Martha, we can be entangled in the details and neglect the most important thing ... the listing to Jesus' word. We need not make our faith more difficult than it needs to be and remember, it is very simple. It is the listening to Jesus that is the better portion and we should never deny ourselves that.

How important is St. Joseph?

Everything we know about the husband of Mary comes from Scripture. We know that Joseph was a humble carpenter and a working man, whom God gave authority to care for the child Jesus... as "foster father'. "Is this not the carpenter's son?" (Matthew 13:55). He wasn't rich, because when they brought Jesus to the Temple to be circumcised, and for Mary to be purified, all they had to give was not a lamb, but only one pair of pigeons, because they didn't have the money (Luke 2:24).

Despite his humble work and means, Joseph came from the royal lineage of David – *(the greatest king of Israel).* The angel who first told Joseph about Jesus greets him as "son of David," ... a royal title used also for Jesus.

We know that Joseph was a very caring man. When he discovered that Mary was pregnant after they had been betrothed, he knew the child was not his. But, he was not as yet aware that she was carrying the Son of God. He knew that women accused of adultery could be stoned to death, so he resolved to send her away quietly so she wouldn't expose herself to shame or cruelty. However, when an angel came to Joseph in a dream and told him, "Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will give birth to a Son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins," he did as the angel told him, and took Mary as his wife. (Matthew 1:19-25). When the angel came again to tell him that his family was in danger, he immediately left everything he owned... all his family and friends, and fled to a strange country with his young wife and the baby. He waited in Egypt without question until the angel told him it was safe to go back (Matthew 2:13-23).

St. Joseph is honored and prayed to by many Churches throughout the world - USA, Canada, Korea, China, Mexico, Austria, Belgium, Croatia, Peru, Vietnam; of the regions Carinthia, Styria, Tyrol, Sicily, etc. Saint Joseph is the Patron Saint for the Universal Church, unborn children, fathers, workers, travelers, immigrants and, a happy death. *St. Joseph, help me to Love Jesus like Mary and you did.*








Exemplification to Fourth Degree
