SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

To have your child baptized, you must be a registered
parishioner in good standing for at least 3 months
and schedule at least one month prior to the desired date.
A baptismal class is required for first time parents.
Please call the office to schedule.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

To be married at the parish, you or your intended spouse
or your parents must be a registered parishioner
in good standing for at least six months.
The couple will need to talk with a priest or deacon
six months before the anticipated wedding date.
Marriage preparation classes are required.
If a prior marriage is involved, one year notice
may be necessary.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK (ANOINTING)

Anointing is available upon request for serious illness,
before surgery and in an emergency any time.
Also offered after all Masses the first weekend of the month.

from Fr. Jim ...

Last night, we endured one of the biggest barrages of Russian missiles and drones. From midnight until 6am, the city of Kyiv was pummeled. There were no military targets hit, it was all pure terror. As of this moment, at least ten people were confirmed killed, with hundreds injured. Those totals will rise. One apartment complex was directly hit and as of now there are two parents who sit in the ash of their former home, and await the fate of their son who is buried in the rubble.

Today I will attend St. Nicholas Cathedral and celebrate the feast of Corpus Christi with the Ukrainian people. I will mourn and weep with them over the absolute evil and sinfulness of this war. I will also pray for the rest of the Body of Christ, to turn toward a clear eyed view of the world unclouded, by the casual acceptance and even the defense of the outright terrorism, sinfulness and cruelty of the Herods of this world. I will pray that the Body of Christ be devoid of the hatred, the casual racism, division, greed, selfishness, and the ease in which we are tempted to see some humans as less than others. I will pray for a release and an ebbing of the rage, anger and disappointment I feel toward the world and its leaders on this dark smoky day.

The sun is setting here in Kyiv, tomorrow I will go to Kharkiv. There will be more air raids tonight ... more cruelty, evil, greed, selfishness, acceptance and ignorance in the world, but we as believers, in the darkness of Good Friday, cling to the brightness of Easter Sunday.

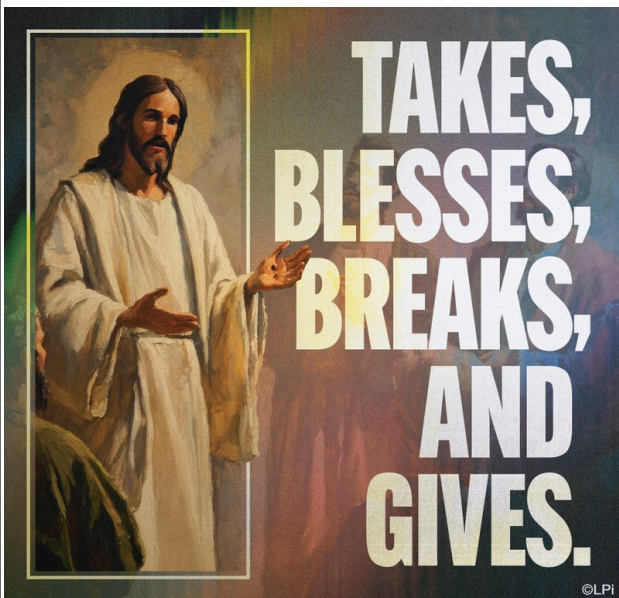

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Luke 9:11-17

A Catholic friend of mine occasionally says, “The Eucharist is not a noun. It’s a verb.” In so saying, he is making the point that the Eucharist isn’t simply Jesus’ bodily presence given to us in holy Communion. It also manifests the dynamic pattern by which Christ actively loves and saves us. He teaches us to cooperate with that pattern. This Eucharist actually embodies four verbs: Jesus takes, blesses, breaks, and gives. Let’s consider each one.



He takes: Do we acknowledge that we are totally in God’s hands?
Do we receive everything in our lives as a gift, and responsibly with it?

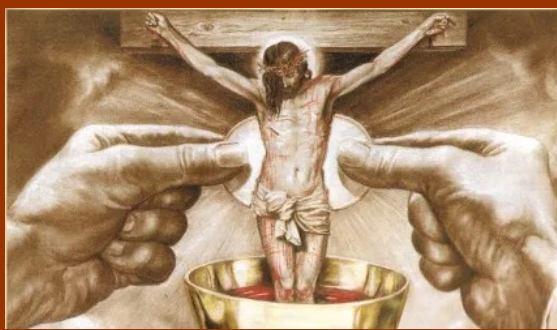
He blesses: Do we actively reflect that Jesus makes us holy in our baptism? Do we embrace our bodies and souls as temples of God, worthy of love, peace, and joy?

He breaks: Do we run from failure and disappointment, from getting old or being ignored? Are we too worried about getting hurt or sick? Do we embrace our sufferings with confidence?

He gives: Are we willing to make our lives a gift for others?
Are we confident that we will always have enough love to give to others, that God will always provide enough for us?
Do we rejoice in giving away what we have to others, expecting nothing in return?

This is the dynamic life the Eucharist empowers us to live.

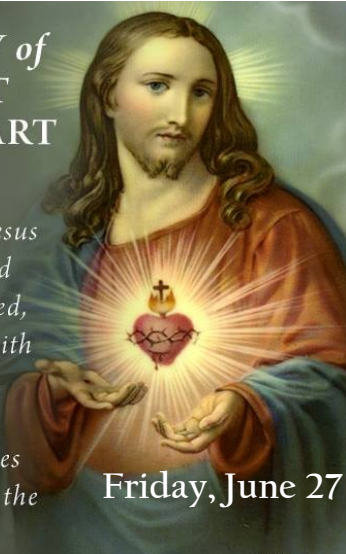

Two sessions will be offered for anyone from St. Anne or St. Patrick parishes; hopefully one will work for you!

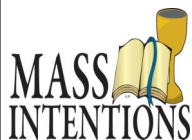
