SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

To have your child baptized, you must be a registered parishioner in good standing for at least 3 months and schedule at least one month prior to the desired date. A baptismal class is required for first time parents.

Please call the office to schedule.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

To be married at the parish, you or your intended spouse or your parents must be a registered parishioner in good standing for at least six months.

The couple will need to talk with a priest or deacon six months before the anticipated wedding date.

Marriage preparation classes are required.

If a prior marriage is involved, one year notice may be necessary.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK (ANOINTING)

Anointing is available upon request for serious illness, before surgery and in an emergency any time.

Also offered after all Masses the first weekend of the month.

PASTORAL VISITATIONS

Please call the parish office when a parishioner is admitted to any of the area hospitals/care centers - even temporarily - or is homebound and desires Holy Communion or a pastoral visit.

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

Sts. Peter And Paul, Apostles

Matthew 16:13-19

What do you call brothers who are born on the same day? Twins, of course. That is what we celebrate today in the inestimable saints, Peter and Paul. Wait: twins? Yes. The early Church believed that Peter and Paul were martyred in Rome on the same day. Since the day of martyrdom is celebrated as a saints' birth into eternal life, the result is striking: Peter and Paul are twins in God's family, the Church.

Who should care about this? Well, anyone who longs to live in a world marked by love and peace. Remember, the Romans believed that twins, Romulus and Remus, founded their city through an act of fratricide, the former murdering the latter. Sadly, the structures of this fallen world emerge through violence between those who should love each other. But in the Church, a new city has been founded upon this new set of twins, embodying the non-violent power of Jesus' cross and resurrection.

That's why traditional icons represent Peter and Paul in a fraternal and warm embrace. Contrasted with the violence of Rome's founders, it challenges us with a bold claim: do we believe that structures of merciful love are more powerful and lasting than those based on power, violence, and domination? Am I willing to see others in my life as my "twin," with whom I am called to give my life for Christ, or as my rival? Am I committed to living what is embodied in Romulus and Remus, or in Peter and Paul?

- 9) Our Angel will fight against evil with all his strength to protect you. Our Angel is a warrior, a strong and courageous fighter who cares for us both day and night... from birth until death.

Your Guardian Angel has basically two jobs, and that is to keep us from evil, and to get us into Heaven!



The *First Fridays Devotion*, also known as the Nine First Fridays Devotion, originated from the visions and revelations experienced by St. Margaret Mary Alacoque in the 17th century. Specifically, these visions occurred in Paray-le-Monial, France, where Jesus Christ

appeared to her and revealed His Sacred Heart, emphasizing the need for devotion and reparation for the sins and ingratitude directed towards it. The *First Fridays Devotion* is simple, but not easy: go to Mass and receive communion every first Friday of the month for nine consecutive months with the intention of honoring the Sacred Heart and making reparation for sins. You can begin your devotion this Friday, July 4th — 9:00 am at St. Anne.

The promotion of Eucharistic communion on the first Friday of each month, for example, sent a powerful message at a time when many people had stopped receiving communion because they were no longer confident of God's mercy and forgiveness and regarded communion as a kind of reward for the perfect.
