SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

To have your child baptized, you must be a registered parishioner in good standing for at least 3 months and schedule at least one month prior to the desired date. A baptismal class is required for first time parents. Please call the office to schedule.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

To be married at the parish, you or your intended spouse or your parents must be a registered parishioner in good standing for at least six months. The couple will need to talk with a priest or deacon six months before the anticipated wedding date. Marriage preparation classes are required. If a prior marriage is involved, one year notice may be necessary.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK (ANOINTING)

Anointing is available upon request for serious illness, before surgery and in an emergency any time. Also offered after all Masses the first weekend of the month.

PASTORAL VISITATIONS

Please call the parish office when a parishioner is admitted to any of the area hospitals/care centers - even temporarily or is homebound and desires Holy Communion or a pastoral visit.

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

15th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Luke 10:25-37

I used to be a bad neighbor. I'd get wrapped up in my life and ignore those around me. Then I found sage advice from Benjamin Franklin to this effect: to be a better neighbor, ask someone to do a favor for you. It's counterintuitive, isn't it? Tell strangers that I need their help? Yuck. I'll risk looking needy. Worse, I'll be indebted to them. But I tried it, and it works like a charm. Recently I asked my neighbor Alan for a hacksaw, and Inga for an egg. They kindly obliged, and our friendship is growing.



This week we hear a scribe of the law cynically ask Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?" (Luke 10:29). Like him, we prefer to keep the list of our "neighbors" as short as possible. It requires less interruption and inconvenience. But when Jesus tells the parable of the Good Samaritan, he exposes the lonely, cold-heartedness tendency of the scribe's (and our) heart.

My "neighbor" is anyone I encounter who manifests a concrete need.

There isn't time to require any other credential because human need opens us to the happy reciprocity which is love.

Jesus' words challenge us this week to ask a neighbor for help in some small way. How marvelous that God himself shows us how. He moves into our world and asks us to love Him with small deeds of love. Maybe that's where Ben Franklin got the idea.

A walk at THE VATICAN

St. Peter's Basilica

St. Peter's is a church built in Renaissance style located in the Vatican City west of the Tiber River. It has one of the largest domes in the world. The dome itself is a feature of the skyline of Rome and covers an area of 0.34 acres. It is described as "holding a unique position in the Christian world", and "is the greatest of all churches of Christendom".

At the heart of the basilica is the burial site of Saint Peter, the first Bishop of Rome (first Pope). Two curving marble staircases lead to the underground chapel of St. Peter's burial tomb. It is directly beneath the high altar above, also known as the *Altar of the Confession or Chapel of the Confession*, named in reference to the confession of faith by St. Peter, which led to his martyrdom. For this reason, many popes, cardinals and bishops have been buried at St. Peter's since the Early Christian period.

It is one of the four Major Basilicas of Rome, (all of which are Papal Basilicas). The others are the Basilicas of St. John Lateran, St. Mary Major, and St. Paul outside the Walls.

In the Vatican City proper the "Chair of Saint Peter" an ancient chair sometimes presumed to have been used by St. Peter himself, but which was a gift from Charles the Bald and was used by many popes.

The Vatican City had been a cemetery for some years before the Circus of Nero was built. It was a burial ground for the numerous executions in the Circus, and contained many Christian burials as for many years after the burial of Saint Peter, many Christians chose to be buried near Peter.






Spirit of Truth: Journal Writing and Prayer
